# Master Tones

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## 1 Introduction

**The Widener (TW)** is a plugin that alternates the width of the stereo image from narrow to wide. The Widener processes **stereo signals**.

To employ the effects to specific frequency bands, utilize the **EQ options**, which is comprised of continuous filters from **Low Frequency (LF)**, **Low Mid (LM)**, **High Mid (HM)**, to **High Frequency (HF)**.

The highest working sampling rate is at **96kHz** and the internal computational sampling rate is at **192kHz**. Additionally, oversampling is set by default in order to preserve the clarity and the quality of mastering-grade analog gears.

The IN and OUT faders can adjust input and output levels. The signal will have more coloring with more input level. To keep the volume at certain level while changing one of the gains, enable the link button and they will move reversely. The Widener also offers various presets to get started efficiently.

The Widener is powered by Master Tones' **Ariosa** Technology. Ariosa is an AI modeling framework developed by a group of researchers and DSP engineers with a strong passion towards music. Furthermore, from choosing hardware to quality assessment, Master Tones collaborates with accomplished musicians and Tonmeisters to ensure the finest quality of the delivered content.



# 1.1 Key Features


Modification the width of the stereo sound image
EQ filter for the plugin to function at certain frequency range
Highest supporting sampling rate at 96kHz (up to 192 kHz internal working sampling rate)
Intuitive and neat UI/UX, easy to navigate
Input/Output gains with reverse link
Presets that help with fast mixing

## 2 Installation

is available in VST3, AU and AAX formats, and can run on most of major DAWs. Follow the installer instructions and the plugins will be installed to the appropriate places.

#### 2.1 Activation

Login is required for both trial and regular version. Register on Master Tones official website - https://www.master-tones.com/.



After logging in, the page will look like the following:



The trial version has 14 days of trial period. If already purchased, click the "activate" button to use the regular version. Internet connection is required during the whole process.

# 2.2 Deactivation

To deactivate the product, click the "Master Tones" mark on the bottom right.



A floating window will pop up:



Click "Deactivate" and enter the username and password, then the deactivation is complete. Note that the Internet connection is also required during the whole process.

# 3 User Interface

#### 3.1 Panel Overview

There are three major components on the interface from left to right: Gains, Spatial Adjustment and EQ. On the top left, various presets are available in the drop-down menu; on the top right is the Bypass button.



# 3.2 Spatial Adjustment

Centering at the panel, the **WIDTH** slider adjusts the stereo sound image from narrow to wide. By turning it from "Min" toward "Max", the image becomes wider.



Double click the digits to manually enter the desired values of the slider.

# 3.3 EQ Slider

The EQ slider is a filter from low to high frequencies. The slider is displayed in four discrete scales: **Low Frequency (LF)**, **Low Mid (LM)**, **High Mid (HM)**, to **High Frequency (HF)**, but the operation is continuous, which enables precise control or design automation without hearing any glitch. Enable/disable the EQ filter by pressing the "EQ" button at the bottom.

#### 3.4 Gains

There are two different gain faders operating on input and output signals respectively.



Units are displayed in dB scale. If the signal peak is greater than 0dB, the warning (digits in red color) will pop out on the top of the fader. Click the digits can let it disappear. If the plugin is overdriven by excessive input volume, the signals will be gradually colored, therefore having more analog distortion.

#### 3.5 Link Button



To keep the volume at certain level while changing one of the gains, enable the link button between the gain sliders and the gain volumes will go reversely. One scenario is to overdrive by increasing the input gain, the output gain will decrease automatically to keep the level balance.

#### 3.6 Presets

On the top left corner, there are several presets designed by collaborative artists and musicians. It's a good starting point to get familiar with the plugin.

## 3.7 Bypass

On the top right corner, there is a button that allows bypassing the plugin, temporarily disable the effects.

## 4 Quick Start

- Step 1: enable the EQ by pressing the "EQ" button.
- Step 2: set the Width slider to 11 or higher
- Step 3: adjust EQ and target the desired frequencies
- · Step 4: adjust the Width slider to proper value
